Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I wanted to use this space this month to update you on my illness. As you may know, in January I was diagnosed with Mild Cognitive Impairment caused by Early-onset Alzheimer's Disease. I am doing well now and see myself serving for many more years but will only continue to serve as long as I can be effective.

One of David & I's hopes was that I could receive treatment for the disease. There are lots of lifestyle changes that help brain health that I have implemented in my life. There is currently only one FDA approved treatment drug for the treatment of amyloid plaques. Insurance will not approve the use of this drug, so I began to look for a clinical trial I might be able to participate in. I have been accepted into a clinical trial at the Rockefeller Neuroscience Institute at WVU Hospital in Morgantown. We are excited about the possibility of this treatment slowing the progression of the disease.

There are some accommodations for treatment that I will need to make. I will be receiving treatment for 3-4 days once every 28 days. I will be receiving treatment for 12 months and then followed by the medical team for 5 years. On the week of treatment, I will be unable to record worship. My mom, Rev. Patricia Jarvis, has volunteered to record worship that week and preach. Keith White has agreed

to provide pastoral care of the congregation on treatment weeks and substitute for mom when needed. I am thankful for their help and support.

I will be unavailable during the treatment days but plan to otherwise work as I regularly do. I'll keep you updated on treatment days and weeks. Our family has been praying that whatever is in my best interest will occur and we see this as an answer to that prayer. I ask now that you pray for my safety in this trial and that it will successfully slow the disease progression. Your support has been a great gift to David & me, and we appreciate you! Some have asked how you can best support us. As I mentioned, prayers are so important. We will also be boarded Abram, our dog. If you'd like help with his care by sponsoring a night or two of that, we would appreciate the assistance.

Please feel free to ask me any questions you might have, I'm happy to answer them.

After a couple of postponements due to the Pandemic, our Retreat Day with







The Brothers write and arrange all of their music and just completed their 5th CD project.


