Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have entered the season of Lent, preparing for Easter. I am hopeful that you are doing some spiritual preparation for that day – it is the most important event in our faith. Perhaps you are taking advantage of some opportunities that the church is offering by participating in our Lenten Study classes or reading "The Sanctuary for Lent" or "The Upper Room." Maybe you are renewing your commitment to attending worship or doing some other activity to help get ready for the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. If this hasn't happened for you yet, it's not too late and it will make a difference in how you experience Easter!

But think with me for a moment about Easter Sunday and the season that follows. We do many things at Easter to proclaim our faith and our joy. We dress up. We decorate. We go to church. We sing. And we hear the resurrection stories: Mary Magdalene in the garden, Peter and John and the empty tomb, the folded grave clothes. We know these stories well, but we want to hear them again. Jesus has conquered death and shown us the resurrected life!

One striking detail in many of the Resurrection stories is that Jesus came, but at first the disciples did not recognize him. No one fully understands what this means, but at the very least it means Jesus was changed in some way. And even if we don't understand everything that happened on that first Easter, we can say this: Jesus was raised from death, and points us toward a next step, a transformation. He is transformed. And in him, we are also being transformed. Every day,

our faith tells us that our lives are being changed. We are becoming like Jesus, moment by moment, day by day.

In the meantime, as we journey through Lent, let us each be deliberate about how we will spend this season. Let it not be "business as usual," lest Easter Sunday be just another day. Choose right now how you observe the weeks of Lent. And may each of us be granted a holy Lent, as we deepen our friendship with the Crucified Christ, and prepare to celebrate his resurrection.

SOME LENTEN DISCIPLINES

These mostly have to do with personal lifestyle. Why would these be appropriate for this season? It's because our faith tells us that Lent is a set-apart season, to prepare us to celebrate Easter. Observing these small disciplines helps us to remember that. They all require us to pay attention and exercise self-denial, and help us to think about the One whom we seek to follow and honor, and who denied himself for our sake.

- During Lent, if you don't need it, don't buy it.
- Throw or give away 40 bags of unneeded "stuff" for the 40 days of Lent.
- Do 40 days of home organization.
- No gossiping.
- No eating after dinner.
- No soda.
- Don't eat out.
- Don't complain.
- Replace 30 minutes of TV with 30 extra minutes of prayer/ devotional time.
- Say 3 nice things to 3 people each day.
- Send a note of appreciation or encouragement to someone.
- Sit in silence for 10 minutes each day.
- Pay anonymously for someone's coffee or meal.
- Fast for one meal a week and donate the cost to the Food Pantry.
- "Fast" from the notion that nothing you do makes any difference.

Try one or more! See if it makes a difference as you journey through Lent.

While in full time ministry, Jim McCune served in local churches in the West Virginia Conference and was also campus pastor at Marshall University and Community Service Coordinator at Potomac State College of WVU.

Throughout his ministry, Jim has led dozens of work teams to serve in places across the West Virginia Conference, the United States, and in Puerto Rico following natural disasters.


Under his leadership, Elizabeth Memorial UMC partnered with other churches in the Nine Rivers District to build a home in the Clendenin area following the 2016 flood.
