As we move into one of the busiest seasons of the year, Pastor Mark Mayfield joins us to discuss patience. It is reprinted with permission.

At Last...

Margie and I watched our mums as they grew this year and were very pleased with their growth. As fall approached, we saw that the mums were loaded with flower buds and just knew the plants would be covered in flowers soon, so we watched them closely and waited for the flowers. And waited. And waited. And waited. Although those mums were loaded with flower buds, it seemed like the flowers were never going to open up to show off their beauty. Of course, in their own time, the mums did at last burst out in their full fall colors.

After the mums did flower, I thought about how anxious Margie and I were to see them in their splendor. We were a bit impatient in our waiting and thought the flowers should appear in our time, not the flower's time. It was only after the flowers did appear that I remembered the 3rd chapter of Ecclesiastes where Solomon wrote that there is a time for everything. That Scripture led my thoughts to the 1st chapter of the Epistle of James that explains the importance of having patience. In fact, as we read the New Testament of our Holy Scriptures, we find that one of the most important virtues of a Christian should be patience.

I am sorry to say that we people of today usually lack the virtue of patience. Have you ever been stopped at a red light while driving and found yourself tapping your fingers and muttering, "Hurry up, let's go!"? Have you ever found yourself complaining about how slow your internet is if you have to wait more than a few seconds for it to work? Have you ever complained about how slow "fast food" restaurants are? I fear that we have become a society who crave instant gratification and hate having to be patient for anything.

I suppose this lack of patience is not a new thing, but rather a part of our human nature. In the 16th chapter of Genesis, we read that Abraham and Sarah grew impatient waiting to have their own children, so they came up with a plan to speed up that process. The product of that plan caused a rift between nations that still exists today. In the 32nd chapter of Exodus, we read that the Israelites grew impatient while waiting for Moses to bring them back the word of God from Mount Sinai and formed a golden calf to worship. Had it not been for the intervention of Moses, all of those people would have been destroyed and God would have started a whole new people from the line of Moses.

I am sure that many Christians look at the evil in our world today and grow impatient for the coming of Jesus Christ, wanting all of the evil to disappear. We sometimes wonder why God is so slow in fulfilling His promise to destroy all unrighteousness and take all of the redeemed of Jesus Christ to live eternally in heaven. We need to remember that God is not slow, but rather operating on His holy timeframe. We need to be patient and ever watchful for God's time, when at last, Jesus Christ will come and take us home to live with Him forever.




