Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Saturday, August 27th was our Church Retreat and what a great day we had! We talked about many things around the question: how do we make disciples for Jesus Christ? We kept as our focus the strong culture of mission support in this congregation.

What did we conclude? Many things! We think the missions work we do is important and should stay a priority. However, we are lacking when it comes to using that work to building relationships that might lead others to Christ or stronger discipleship. We don't invite people to join us like we should, we don't interact with those we are ministering with, and we don't let others know what we are doing.

With that in mind we set some priorities. The top 3, we are committed to doing now and hope you will prayerfully consider how you too can support these.

- 1. <u>Use our mission work as outreach</u>. Let people know what we are doing through things like t-shirts, social media posts, articles in the newspaper. Some ways you might help with this is: organize the creation of t-shirts (we already have a church logo), expand our social media presence (currently we are only on Facebook), submit pictures and articles to the newspaper. Surely there are many other ways, what can you think of?
- 2. Research and design a <u>comprehensive</u> <u>children & youth vision</u> that can be implemented, perhaps in stages. *Some ways*

you can help: offer to be a volunteer for a children/youth event, help with planning, support financially, share ideas you might have.

3. <u>Ask</u> those who aren't members (or members we haven't seen in awhile) to help with ministries. Invite others to join us as we build the Kingdom of God! Some ways you can help: chose an upcoming ministry (see this newsletter & calendar for options) and invite someone to join you for it. Make it clear this isn't a formal commitment to join the church, but a chance to do something good for someone. This is something everyone can do! Ask Clare for ideas if you're struggling.)

Some additional priorities:

- * Have Disciple Bible Study
- Advertise ourselves as a "come as you are" congregation that all are welcome to
- Become more welcoming/improve hospitality
- * Gather casually, but purposefully, outside the church walls (*organize a book club*, *golf outing*, *seating section at the football stadium*)
- * Ask others what needs they have, what can we pray for?
- * Inviting folks to Church or Spiritual development
- * Adjust worship to meet the needs of our guests

This is just a starting point. I'll keep you updated in the newsletter and encourage you consider how you can support these ideas with your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness as we "have a heart to love and serve others."


Clare's Health Update

How things have changed in just a month! In early August I had some additional brain health testing done and the results were great. There is no progression of the disease in 6 months. We are thrilled at this miraculous development!

What does this mean? First, I'm no longer in the Clinical Trial because I do not meet the criteria. That's a good thing! I do still have Mild Cognitive Impairment, but for the moment, it doesn't seem to be progressing. My doctors do not want to see me for a full year, unless I think I need an appointment sooner. Your prayers have been helping! Please keep them going. For my part, I'll continue the lifestyle changes I have made that seem to be making a difference. And together, we'll move into the future with confidence that God is with us in all things. Thank you again for your support!

CHURCH AND SCHOOL ENGAGEMENT

On <u>Sunday, October 2nd from 4 - 6:00 PM</u>, (Please note the time change) Rev. Mike Linger, Director of the House of the Carpenter in Wheeling, WV and Rev. Neil Leftwich, our District Superintendent, will be leading a workshop at our church in the fellowship hall on connecting churches with the community specifically through partnerships with schools. This is a conference wide project which has been proven successful in Wheeling and is being shared with other churches in our conference.



In this workshop we will be gathering to equip the church for reaching out to the school. The hour & a half we spend together will include:

- Developing our understanding of current student needs
- The biblical/theological underpinnings for this type of ministry
- Building and working in collaborative ministry
- How to begin building a relationship and engaging with your local school
- Some ideas of ways churches are ministering with schools

The workshop is based on the book, <u>The Mission-Minded Guide to Church and School Partnerships</u> by Jake McGlothin. Clare has free copies of the book if you'd like to have one in advance of the workshop.

Everyone is invited to attend and you are welcome to bring a friend, teacher or others who are interested in getting involved with our community. This event is supported by our local Pleasants Area Ministerial Association and other churches in the area are planning to attend. What a great way to form a partnership with sister churches and strengthen ministry to our children and youth.

WAYS TO GIVE

You can put a check in the mail to PO Box 100; you can drop off your tithes at the church office when we are open during the week; you can set up bill pay on your personal checking account or you can go to the church's web page (smwvumc.com) and press the green "give" button that takes you to Tithe-ly.

Tithe-ly is a secure online giving platform you can use for a onetime offering or a revolving donation. It is directly deposited into the church's account. It automatically adds the service fee to your offering, but you can opt out of that if you'd prefer.
